

## 10 Pro Tips: Teaching Kids Sacrificial Giving & Generosity

- 1. Use 3 Jars: Give, Save, Spend**  
Help kids divide their money into three jars. Encourage them to put the "give" jar first — teaching that giving comes before getting.
- 2. Tell Stories of Giving Heroes**  
Read Bible stories (like the widow's mite or the boy with the loaves and fish) or share real-life examples of generous people. Make generosity something to admire.
- 3. Let Kids Give Their Own Gifts**  
Whether it's birthday money or allowance, allow children to decide what portion to give. Ownership turns giving into joy, not duty.
- 4. Make Sacrifice Visible**  
Skip a treat or meal out as a family to give that money away instead — then talk about how it felt and what it meant.
- 5. Celebrate Every Act of Generosity**  
Praise the heart behind even the smallest gift. "You gave because you love — that's just like Jesus!"
- 6. Visit Where Your Gifts Go**  
Take kids to see the impact of giving — a food pantry, a missions display, or even photos from church updates. Connect giving to people and stories.
- 7. Let Giving Be a Worship Act**  
Bring kids with you when you give at church. Let them drop in the envelope or scan the giving code themselves — and pray over the gift together.
- 8. Set a Family Giving Goal**  
Choose a project or cause together (e.g., sponsor a child, buy a goat for a village, stock a blessing box) and track your progress with visuals.
- 9. Talk About Tithing as Trust**  
Help kids understand tithing not as paying a bill, but as trusting God first with what we've been given — and watching how He provides.
- 10. Teach That Giving Isn't Always Money**  
Encourage generosity with time, kindness, creativity, and prayer. Generous hearts are about *how* we live, not just *what* we give.
